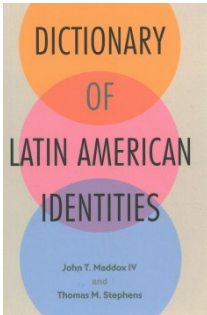
## La Voz

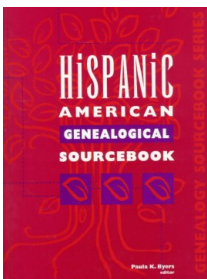
## Cesar Chavez : autobiography of La Causa

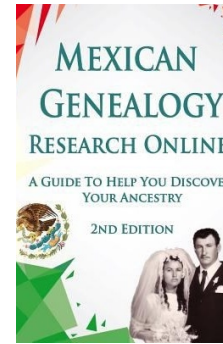
## Dictionary of Latin American identities

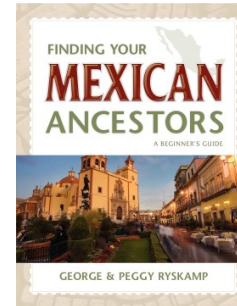
## Hispanic American genealogical sourcebook

Provides historical genealogical information on Hispanic Americans. The book looks specifically at their emigration history and genealogical records and features a directory of genealogical information.



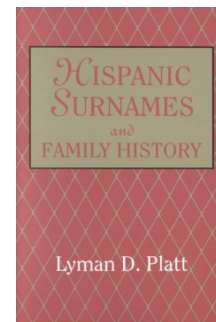
## Mexican Genealogy Research Online

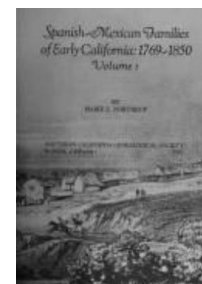
## Finding your Mexican ancestors : a beginner's guide
